PEAHEN

HOW TO SPOT ME? Look in urban parks, farms, or estates where peafowl have been introduced.

- I'm the understated counterpart to the peacock—earth-toned with soft brown, gray, and green feathers.
- I may seem shy, but I'm alert, curious, and often seen wandering under trees or resting in flowerbeds.

P-DID YOU KNOW?

Peahens are highly discerning—they choose mates based on the quality and symmetry of the peacock's tail display. But they're also fierce protectors—mothers will guard and guide their chicks with sharp calls and quick feet.

HOW TO PROTECT ME?

- Observe from a respectful distance and avoid feeding processed food-stick to seeds, grains, or leafy greens if feeding is permitted.
- Advocate for safe, clean park spaces where ornamental or semi-wild birds like us can roam without stress.
- Keep dogs leashed in areas where peafowl live—startling chases can lead to injuries.
