## BELTED KINGFISHER

### ô™Ô HOW TO SPOT ME?

- Look along rivers, estuaries, ponds, and urban shorelines—especially where the water is calm and full of fish.
- I'm stocky, with a large head, a shaggy crest, and a thick, pointed bill.
- I'm slate-blue with a white belly and a blue-gray band across my chest. Females also have a rusty bandwe're one of the few bird species where females are more colorful!

## - DID YOU KNOW?

Belted Kingfishers dive headfirst to catch fish, using their keen eyesight to spot prey underwater. We nest in burrows dug into sandy banks, sometimes over a meter long-making us one of the few North American birds to nest underground.

## **■** HOW TO PROTECT ME?

- Protect riverbanks and natural shoreline edges—they're essential for our nesting and hunting.
- Avoid shoreline development that removes sandy slopes or dense vegetation.
- Watch from a distance—loud noises or quick movement can disrupt our feeding and nesting routines.
