ô™Ô HOW TO SPOT ME?

- Look in ponds, lakes, wetlands, or even large puddles in parks and neighborhoods.
- Males have a glossy green head, bright yellow bill, and curled tail feather; females are brownspeckled for camouflage.
- Watch for dabbling—tipping headfirst into shallow water—or waddling in search of snacks.

- DID YOU KNOW?

Mallards are the ancestors of most domestic duck breeds, and are found on every continent except Antarctica. They're also surprisingly talkative—females give loud quackquack-quack calls, while males sound softer and raspier.

HOW TO PROTECT ME?

- Don't feed bread-it offers no nutrition and pollutes the water. Instead, offer birdseed, oats, or peas (if at all).
- Keep dogs leashed around nesting areas and ducklings.
- Support wetland conservation and advocate for clean, trash-free water bodies.
